



CATTLEYA CULTURE

General guide to basic culture:

LIGHT: Cattleyas require good light but not direct sunlight.

TEMPERATURE: While most Cattleyas will grow cold, they do appreciate some protection in winter, such as being placed on a back verandah where you can control the watering.

WATERING: In summer they may need to be watered two times per week, allowing to dry out between waterings; reduce to once a fortnight in winter; always water early in the day.

FERTILISING: Half recommended strength of liquid fertiliser; preferably use flowering type formula fortnightly from spring through summer.

POTTING: Repot when plant has overgrown pot or the potting mix has become soggy. Plants may be potted in medium grade orchid bark or similar.

PESTS & DISEASES: Mealy bugs, scale and munching insects are the main problems and can be treated by visiting your local nursery and purchasing the required treatments.
