



SOFTCANE DENDROBIUMS

General guide to basic culture:

POSITION: Give as much light and air as possible from April to October. Softcanes can tolerate direct sunlight in autumn/winter. Some protection may be needed in summer – use 30%-50% shade cloth if necessary.

TEMPERATURE: They are suitable to grow in Sydney temperatures throughout the year.

WATERING: Softcanes require copious amounts of water during the summer growing period, November to April; reduce watering in winter but do not let dry out completely.

FERTILISER: Fertilise weekly during growing period November to April; use high potassium liquid fertiliser to promote flowering; stop fertiliser completely at end of April; recommence at beginning of October. Six-month slow release granules at time of repotting may be used.

MEDIA/POTTING: Repot after flowering has finished; may stay 2 to 3 years in same pot/mix. Use open, free-draining bark mix (bark/perlite/coco chunks/charcoal); use small pots; support each cane by staking.

GENERAL: Softcanes are generally easy to grow and flower; they are easier to manage if they are hung where they will receive maximum light and air movement.
